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Additional Comments to Manuscript and Citation Guidelines

Legal Note Guidelines:

2. Word Limit: Essay/Note: 1,500-2,000 words

3. Format for submission

3.1. Submissions must be .docx microsoft word files.

3.2. The file must contain two component: a) an introductory page containing the title of the submission, type of submission (article/essay/ case comment/book review), salutation, full name and a short bio-data of the main author, salutation, full name and a short bio-data of the co-authors (if present); b) the main content.

3.3. The font of the content must be 12 points, Times New Roman.

3.4. Files should have simple formatting.

4. Gender inclusive references: Whenever possible, use a gender-inclusive language.

Examples: reasonable person (not reasonable man), he/she (not he).

5. Style of citation: The Bluebook, 20th Edition. Full citations for any reference must be put in form of footnotes. Inbody citation and endnotes are not accepted.

6. Acronyms and Abbreviations

6.1. An acronyms or abbreviations may be used for subsequent referencing.

6.2. Popular names of books, cases, reports, statutes and similar sources shall also be introduced in the format of an abbreviation and acronym.

7. Italics

7.1. All the words and phrases other than English must be italicized, including Thai

7.2. If the author chooses to use popular names of books, articles, reports, cases, statutes and similar sources should be italicized, whether used in the main text or footnote.
