

## Law Review Citations:

(As we have stated, if the document was first written in Thai language, it will be stated in the citation first in Thai, then in English language. If you feel the Thai or English version needs correction, please advise. **Maybe using Track Changes in Review in Word.**)

**Citation begins with a capital letter and ends with a ‘full stop’(.)**

**1<sup>st</sup> in Thai language if the document was first written in Thai, followed by English: Format**

In Thai: Name of Constitution/Act (etc.) (year in Thai), section (etc).

In Thai: Author name, *name of article* or book, beginning page, page with quote (date written in Thai).

## English: Format

Case: *Parties*, Book, beginning page, page with quote (western date = month abbreviation, day, year)

Act (etc): Name of Act (country = if not the US, western year), sec.

## Internet citations:

Link, accessed on date

## Examples:

Thailand Constitution: Constitution (Interim) 2014, sec.

Thailand Supreme Court Decisions: *Name of plaintiff and defendant*, Supreme Court No. 2040/2555 (TH 2009)

Thailand Codes: Criminal Code (TH 1956), sec.

Thailand Acts: Patent Act (TH 1979), sec. Patent Act No. 2 (TH 1992), sec.

Official Publications: *Title of Article*, Royal Thai Gov't Gazette, p. 216 (Dec. 9, 1991)

Newspaper Articles: Author, *Title of Article*, Bangkok Post, page if possible (Nov. 6, 2015)
